Follow These Simple Guidelines

Motor Boaters

Operators of boats (including PWCs) with a HP greater than 25 must have an operator's certificate. The Official New Hampshire Online Boating Safety Course Website is <http://www.boat-ed.com/newhampshire>. Learn online, print your temporary New Hampshire boating license, and get boating.

- Wash your motorboats from any possible exotic plants before launching.
- Take special care not to swamp loons and their babies. Do not follow or come too close to loons. Their nesting area is marked and should be avoided.
- Watch your wakes around kayaks and canoes they also swamp easily.
- Boats at travelling speed need to stay 150 ft. from shore or other objects (rafts, docks) .
- Boaters must have one spotter per skier or ski tube. (If the boat is pulling two tubes, there should be two spotters in addition to the driver.)

Protect Water Quality

- Use biodegradable and phosphate-free detergents, and check labels on other consumer products which may contain phosphates, including some liquid hand soaps, shampoos, hair dyes and toothpastes
- Avoid fertilizer and pesticide use, except limestone, within 25 feet of the lake, and use only slow or controlled release fertilizer beyond 25 feet
- Properly maintain your septic system, including regular pumping and inspection. Also, properly dispose of animal wastes
- Address any soil erosion and storm water runoff issues on your property

Fireworks

Not permitted without written permission of Owner and only during these hours between the hours of 12 noon and 10 PM. The exception is July 4th and New Years Eve. Those two dates it is permissible up to 12 AM on the 4th and 12:15 AM on Jan 1st.

Outdoor Fire Permits

Available at Moultonborough Town Hall, Chickadee Station or the Fire Department.

Feeding Water Birds

Don't! This encourages "duck itch" an unpleasant rash, and disturbs their natural eating habits.

Discourage visits from Bears

Do not put out bird feeders or other food sources. And be sure to store all trash securely.

Use outdoor lights with discretion.

Respect your neighbor and wildlife's need for an artificial light free lake. Stars over Lake are extraordinary.
